



HIGH PERFORMANCE RIDING ACADEMY FAQ

How do I get to Atlantic Motorsport Park?

From Highway #102 take Exit #9 or #10 to Shubenacadie. Follow signs to McPhee's Corner. Proceed up North Salem Road to Race Track Road (formerly Creighton Road). Atlantic Motorsport Park is at the end of Race Track Road.

How do I apply?

Registration form is available at www.atlanticroadracing.com under the Registration Tab. You will receive a confirmation email that your application has been received; this is not confirmation of acceptance into the academy.

What time do I need to be there?

All students must arrive and be ready for registration at **08:00am** Saturday morning. Students failing to arrive on time or sign the waiver will be not be permitted to partake in the academy and forfeit fee paid. The day will end approximately 5pm.

What is the schedule?

Saturday

- 0800 – Sign in, sign the waiver and obtain a numbered sticker for your bike
- 0830 – All Bikes on pit lane ready to be inspected
- 0930 – Classroom session begins in Tech Building
- 1100 – Track walk with instructors in assigned groups
- 1200 – Lunch will be provided
- 1300 – On track sessions with rotation of Group 1, 2 and 3
- 1700 – Track closes

Sunday

- 0900 – On track sessions begin with Group 1, rotating 1, 2, 3
- 1200 – Lunch will be provided
- 1300 – On track sessions begin, rotation where left off
- 1630 – Certificate and T-shirt presentation

When do I need to be there?

All students must arrive and be prepared to sign-in at 8:00am Saturday morning. Failure to sign the waiver means you cannot take part in the academy.

What equipment do I need to wear?

- Full face helmet, minimum DOT, Snell2010 or ECE22-05 approved
- Gloves that cover your wrist and that are in good repair
- Boots that cover the ankles and in good repair.
- A one or two piece riding suit either leather or ballistic/Kevlar type material, two piece suits must be fastened together
- Back protector recommended but not mandatory



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What do I have to do to my motorcycle?

- Remove mirrors, tape headlight, tail light and signal completely
- Have decent tires, not overly worn with decent air pressure
- No leaks from oil, coolant, fuel or brake systems
- Properly functioning front and rear brakes
- Throttle that snaps to the shut position
- Chain and sprocket in good condition

What happens at the academy?

Saturday morning begins with a classroom session in which we discuss techniques that will be used throughout the weekend. You will meet the instructors and discuss basic safety, riding techniques, flags, and proper track entrance and exit.

After the classroom session students will be divided in three groups, beginner, intermediate and advanced. Instructors will lead students on a walk around the track while racers show students the proper lines. The purpose of the track walk is to learn the layout of the track and the best line you'll want to follow around it.

The track portion of the academy begins Saturday after lunch. You'll be on the track for the remainder of Saturday and all day Sunday. Each group rotates through with 15-minute track sessions. The instructors will show you the way and observe you as you ride. If at any time you feel like the group you are in is too fast or too slow you can ask your instructors to move you to a faster or slower group. We want students to be comfortable and have fun.

Will this academy qualify me to go racing?

Yes. Upon completion of the High Performance Riding Academy you can apply for an Atlantic Roadracing League membership which will allow you to go racing.

What if it rains?

The academy runs rain or shine.

How do I know if I have been accepted?

If you have completed the registration form, and submitted payment you are in! Once the academy is full and announcement will be made and we will start a waiting list. If you are on the waiting list we will contact you in the event a registered participant is unable to attend.
